

HISTORY

This is a continuation of my history story I started in November. It covered 1872 to 1887.

- 3-10-1887 Ola Martinson and wife sold Section 29, Township 27, block 13 of the Seventh Addition to H. L.Smithson.
- 12-2-1895 H. L Smithson and wife sold lots 12 to 15 Inclusive 22 to 24 inclusive and 29 to 32 in Block 13 to E. S. Hutchinson, a single person for \$1.00 and other valuable construction.
- 12-6-1898 E. S. Hutchinson, a single person sold to R. A Sankey Lots 11 thru 15, 22-24, 29-36 for \$24000.
- 5-22-1910 The probate court of Sedg. Co. in the matter of the estate of R. A. Sankey who died on or about the 5th of May1910 leaving Mary E, Sankey his widow, 64, He left no children or any grandchildren Property will be about \$4000.00 and real estate about \$50.000.00
- 8-31-1922 After the death of Marv E. Sankey, on 10-20-1920 her executors and trustees viewed her last will and the only heir was her sister Mrs. Hattie Hill age 75. Some property was to be left to Florence S. Rhone that included a diamond ring, Robert M. Moore her library, to Mary Nester Moore her piano and to Mrs. Ada Crum her bracelets. Given to Emma Moore Butler her watch, chain and automobile, and her diamond pin. Her homestead and household items shall be given to Robert M Moore. Others mentioned in the will were Frank B Morris, Arthur Butler Sr. and Irving Crum.

I wonder if the Robert Moore was an ancestor of the Bob Moore Auto Dealer and if Irving Crum and Ada Crum were the ancestors of the former Crum Castle in Riverside? If you know, let me know. Now I will stop the story for now but there will be more in the next issues of the Dispatch. Dorothy

New Year's Day

New Year's Day, also called simply New Year's or New Year, is observed on January 1, the first day of the year on the modern Gregorian calendar as well as the Julian calendar. In pre-Christian Rome under the Julian calendar, the day was dedicated to Janus, god of gateways and beginnings, for whom January is also named. As a date in the Gregorian calendar of Christendom, New Year's Dav liturgically marked the Feast of the Naming and Circumcision of Jesus, which is still observed as such in the Anglican Church and Lutheran Church.

Martin Luther King Day is a United States Federal Holiday. It celebrates the life and achievements of Martin Luther King Jr., an influential American civil rights leader. It is a federal holiday held on the third Monday of January. Martin Luther King Day in 2018 is on Monday, the 15th of January. Martin Luther King Jr. was an American Baptist minister and activist who became the most visible spokesperson and leader in the civil rights movement. He is best known for his role in the advancement of civil rights using the tactics of nonviolence and civil disobedience based on his Christian beliefs and inspired by the nonviolent activism of Mahatma Gandhi.



Groundhog Day was established in 1887 and is a popular tradition celebrated in the United States on February 2. Superstition says that if it is cloudy when a groundhog emerges from its burrow on this available for future letters. Lincoln led the United States through its Civil War-its bloodiest war and perhaps its greatest moral, constitutional, and political crisis. In doing so, he preserved the Union, paved the way for the abolition of slavery, strengthened the federal government, and modernized the economy. Lived: Feb 12, 1809 -Apr 15, 1865 (age 56) Height: 6' 4"



Washington's Birthday is a United States federal holiday celebrated on the third Monday of February in honor of George Washington, the first President of the United States, who was born on February 22, 1732. The holiday therefore can occur on any day from February 15th through the 21st, but never on Washington's actual birthday.
